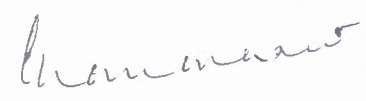

2.1.1 Curricular Design & Development:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The academic programmes are in tune with the goals and objectives of the College.</li><li>• The College follows the curriculum developed by University of Pune to which it is affiliated.</li><li>• Faculty contribute to the <u>review</u> and <u>redesigning</u> of the curriculum by virtue of being members of different committees of the University related to curriculum design.</li></ul>
2.1.2 Academic Flexibility:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• College has two grant-in-aid programmes (B.A &amp; B.Com) and one self-financing programme (B.C.A).</li><li>• The students have <u>limited flexibility</u> in choosing programmes.</li><li>• The College offers <u>eight short-term self-financing courses</u> and one funded by the UGC.</li></ul>
2.1.3 Feedback on Curriculum	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Collecting feed back from students is yet to be systematized.</li><li>• Feedback from other stakeholders is only informal in nature.</li><li>• The follow up action regarding the feedback obtained needs to be <u>streamlined</u>.</li></ul>
2.1.4 Curriculum Update	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Curriculum is generally updated once in three years by the university!</li><li>• The college needs to introduce more <u>recognized add-on</u> courses to strengthen the existing curriculum.</li></ul>
2.1.5 Best Practices in Curricular Aspects (If any):	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The college has introduced a few short-term courses.</li></ul>

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<b>2.2: Teaching- Learning &amp; Evaluation</b>	
2.2.1 Admission Process and Student Profile	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The College follows University and government norms.</li><li>• Adequate publicity is given for admission to the UG programmes.</li><li>• Students are admitted according to merit.</li></ul>
2.2.2 Catering to the Diverse Needs:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Slow and advanced learners are identified through interactions by the teachers in the class in the beginning of the academic year.</li><li>• Remedial classes are arranged for SC/ST and academically weaker students.</li><li>• The institution caters to the needs of students from socially and economically disadvantaged sections.</li></ul>
2.2.3 Teaching-Learning Process:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The teachers prepare subject-wise lesson plan for the entire year.</li><li>• <u>Some</u> of the teachers have started using audio-visual aids in the classes.</li><li>• The initiative for <u>mentoring</u> needs to be systematized.</li></ul>
2.2.4 Teacher Quality:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Teachers are recruited as per government and university norms.</li><li>• Three teachers have Ph.D degree and four possess M.Phil degree.</li><li>• All the sanctioned teaching posts are filled.</li></ul>
2.2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Evaluation process is explained to the students by the teachers at the beginning of the year.</li><li>• Student progress is monitored through class tests, home assignments and terminal examinations.</li><li>• The grievance <u>redressal mechanism</u> needs to be strengthened.</li></ul>
2.2.6 Best Practices in Teaching-Learning and Evaluation (If any) :	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The institution encourages computer literacy among the faculty.</li></ul>

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<b>2.3 Research, Consultancy &amp; Extension:</b>	
2.3.1 Promotion of Research:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The institution has set up a research committee to promote research activities.</li><li>• The college encourages the teachers to participate in seminars and conferences by granting duty leave.</li></ul>
2.3.2 Research and Publications Output:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Teachers have participated in seminars and conferences and a <u>few</u> have presented papers.</li><li>• One minor research project has been completed and there are five ongoing minor projects.</li><li>• There is one research guide in the institution.</li><li>• <u>Some</u> of the teachers have published a few popular articles, mainly in local magazines and newspapers.</li></ul>
2.3.3 Consultancy:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The consultancy services offered are informal in nature.</li></ul>
2.3.4 Extension Activities:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Most of the extension activities are carried out through the NSS unit of the college.</li><li>• Extension activities include community development, health and hygiene awareness, environment awareness, blood donation, AIDS awareness, adult literacy, etc.</li></ul>
2.3.5 Collaborations:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The college has initiated collaborations with local NGOs in a limited way.</li></ul>
2.3.6 Best Practices in Research, Consultancy & Extension (If any):	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Teachers are actively engaged in extension activities.</li></ul>

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<b>2.4 Infrastructure and Learning Resources :</b>	
2.4.1 Physical Facilities for Learning:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The college has a campus area of 0.8 acres and a built up area of 2892.20 sq.mtrs which it shares with the junior college.</li> <li>• There are 14 classrooms, a central library, staff rooms, a computer lab and a separate rest room for women students.</li> <li>• Additional space and infrastructural facilities are needed.</li> </ul>
2.4.2 Maintenance of Infrastructure:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The institution maintains the infrastructure mainly using its own resources.</li> <li>• The maintenance committee looks after the maintenance and repairs of the building and equipments.</li> <li>• Infrastructure maintenance requires further improvement.</li> </ul>
2.4.3 Library as a Learning Resources	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Library has an advisory committee.</li> <li>• The library which is commonly used by the College and the junior college has a total of 18,532 books.</li> <li>• The library services are partially computerized.</li> <li>• Library has <u>limited</u> internet facility.</li> </ul>
2.4.4 ICT as Learning Resources:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The College has altogether 52 computers.</li> <li>• The computer lab has 22 computers with internet facility.</li> <li>• ICT facilities need to be made available to all the students.</li> </ul>
2.4.5 Other Facilities:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The College has <u>limited</u> recreational and indoor games facilities. Provision for outdoor games is inadequate due to space constraints.</li> <li>• Provision for safe drinking water and vehicle parking available.</li> <li>• The UGC has allocated Rs.40,00,000/ for constructing a ladies hostel.</li> </ul>

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2.4.6 Best practices in Infrastructure and Learning Resources(if any)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The available infrastructure facilities are put to optimum use.</li> </ul>

2.5.1 Student Progression:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The overall pass percentage needs to be further improved.</li> <li>The progression to higher education is monitored only in an informal manner.</li> <li>Dropout rate needs to be reduced.</li> </ul>
2.5.2 Student Support:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>College publishes its prospectus annually.</li> <li>Scholarships are provided to economically and socially backward students as per Government rules.</li> <li>The institution has a career guidance cell.</li> </ul>
2.5.3 Student Activities:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students have participated in different sports activities at the university/ state/ national levels and a few have won prizes.</li> <li>Cultural programmes and sports competitions are organized.</li> <li>The College has an alumni association.</li> </ul>
2.5.4 Best Practices in Student Support and Progression (If any):	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The College has effectively implemented the 'Earn and Learn' scheme in collaboration with the University to help needy students.</li> </ul>

2.6.3 Strategy development and deployment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Several committees are formed for the effective functioning of the college.</li> <li>• The college needs to strengthen the system of collecting feed back from the various stakeholders for effective planning and development.</li> </ul>
2.6.4 Human Resource Management:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The management encourages the faculty to participate in different faculty development programmes.</li> <li>• Self-appraisal reports of the faculty are collected every year to evaluate their performance.</li> <li>• All the faculty members are involved in the different curricular and co-curricular activities of the College.</li> </ul>
2.6.5 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The institution gets grant from the UGC, Government and the University.</li> <li>• The College prepares its annual budget regularly and utilizes the funds as per University / Government norms.</li> <li>• College accounts are audited every year by internal as well as external auditors.</li> </ul>
2.6.6 Best Practices in Governance and Leadership (If any):	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Management has initiated a few welfare programmes for the staff members.</li> </ul>

3.1 Institutional Strengths:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Committed management.</li> <li>• Conducive environment for growth and development.</li> <li>• Caters to the higher education aspirations of the weaker sections of the community.</li> </ul>
3.2 Institutional Weaknesses:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Limited number of courses hindering flexibility.</li> <li>• Inadequate ICT enabled teaching-learning facilities.</li> <li>• Constraints of space regarding buildings and playground.</li> </ul>
3.5 Institutional Opportunities:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Introduction of new courses.</li> <li>• Obtaining more funds from the UGC and other funding agencies.</li> <li>• Improving the academic performance of students by organizing remedial courses, tutor-ward system, computer-aided classes, etc more effectively</li> <li>• Equipping students with appropriate skills to make them confident and employable.</li> </ul>
3.4 Institutional Challenges:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Providing more flexibility by starting job-oriented and innovative courses.</li> <li>• Modernising the infrastructural facilities.</li> <li>• Establishing institution-industry linkages by making use of the locational advantage.</li> <li>• Preparing the College towards autonomy.</li> </ul>

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**Section IV: Recommendations for Quality Enhancement of the Institution**

- The institution may introduce job-oriented courses at both UG and PG levels.
- More computers need to be procured and the teachers and students may be exposed to ICT-enabled teaching- learning techniques.
- Computerization of the college administration needs to be completed.
- A language lab and a commerce lab need to be set up.
- Teachers shall be encouraged to publish research papers in peer-reviewed journals and to apply for research projects.
- The performance appraisal and the feed back mechanism need to be systematized.
- The library facilities need to be improved with more space, addition of more books and journals in English and the process of computerization should be completed at the earliest.
- A placement cell may be established and made to work effectively.
- Remedial classes, tutor-ward system and mentoring need to be systematically organized.
- Linkages with industries / institutions may be explored.
- More professional development programmes may be organized for the staff members.
- A long term perspective plan may be formulated for the overall development of the institution.
